Vocabulary Recommendations

Choose one of the following:

audio description - indicates that the alternative is a spoken description of the visual content in the resource that is being adapted, e.g., "Descriptive Video"

audio representation - indicates that the alternative uses sound to represent the intellectual content in the original access mode of the resource that is being adapted

caption - indicates that the alternative is a text caption for the audio component of the resource that is being adapted

e-book - indicates that the alternative is an electronic book

text representation - indicates that the alternative uses text to represent the intellectual content in the original access mode of the resource that is being adapted

sign language - indicates that the alternate is a sign language interpretation of the intellectual content in the original access mode of the resource that is being adapted

visual representation - indicates that the alternative uses visual content to represent the intellectual content in the original access mode of the resource that is being adapted

tactile representation - indicates that the alternative uses touch to represent the intellectual content in the original access mode of the resource that is being adapted
