An access mode through which the intellectual content of the resource is communicated, not including any adaptations.	0 or 1	Unspecified	auditory, tactile, textual, visual	Vocabulary
This element is intended to indicate the human sense or cognitive capability require by the user to process the intellectual content of the resource.				
This element differs from 1.1.1 original access mode in that when used within an adaptation statement, this element refers specifically to the original, unadapted resource, not the described resource. It indicates the access mode of the original resource that is being adapted by this described resource. For example, if the described resource is a caption for a video, then this element would be used to indicate that the original access mode that is being adapted is the audio component of the original video.				

Vocabulary Recommendations

Indicate what senses are required to access the original unadapted resource. Choose one of the following:

auditory - perceived by the sense of human hearing or its equivalent

tactile - perceived by the sense of human touch or its equivalent

textual - perceived by access to or transformation of character strings or text

visual - perceived by the sense of human sight or its equivalent

Note that it is expected that the following vocabulary item will be added to this controlled vocabulary in the upcoming ISO documentation

olfactory - perceived by the sense of human smell or its equivalent
